Celebrating!


Over the next few weeks we will be learning about what a celebration is and how the parish family comes together to celebrate events such as Baptism, Christmas, weddings and Easter.

How To Help At Home...

- Writing about their favourite superhero. What is their name and what special powers do they have?
- Practising reading cvc words and simple sentences
- Writing simple sentences e.g. it is a cat, a big hat, a red bag
- Your child will have a Home Learning book which they can do their work in.
- Thank you to everyone who has been reading at home. The children love to show me how many times you write in their diaries. Please can you continue to support your child by reading five times a week.
