St Peter and St Paul's School Uniform Policy

GIRLS: Grey skirt or pinafore dress with white blouse or white polo shirt
Official school sweatshirt or cardigan with logo
Plain grey school trousers
Plain white socks or grey coloured tights, not patterned
Blue and white gingham dresses may be worn in summer
Children should not wear trousers or leggings with skirts, pinafores or dresses.

BOYS: Grey trousers with white shirt or white polo shirt.
Official school sweatshirt.
Plain white/black /grey socks.
Plain grey school shorts may be worn in summer



School uniform sweatshirts/jumpers can be purchased from Whittakers in Bolton town centre; reading folders are on sale at the school office.



In Year 6, the children have a green school jumper. All families receive a voucher for these, entitling you to a free green jumper from Whittakers.



Active Wear

It is important for the safety of the children that they have suitable clothing whilst taking part in sporting activities.

We have introduced what we call 'Active Wear' for your child's PE day; this consists of a navy blue SPP hoodie, navy blue jogging bottoms, white PE t-shirt and plain black trainers. These should **not** have a logo on them.



Please remember to label your entire child's uniform. It is difficult to find misplaced items of clothing without identification.

Plain black trainers can be purchased from Tesco, Asda, Morrisons, Sainsbury's.

School Shoes

Flat black shoes should be worn as part of the school uniform, not trainers. Boots are not acceptable.



Jewellery

On health and safety grounds we do not allow children to wear jewellery in our school. The exceptions to this rule are a watch and one pair of small, plain gold/silver/white crystal studs. These must not be worn on PE days.

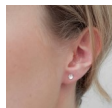
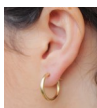
Hair

Children's hair should not be dyed or have any temporary hair pieces in it. Short hair should not be worn shorter than a number 2. Patterns and lines should not be cut into hair.

Hair bobbles and slides should co-ordinate with the uniform - white/blue/black.

Make up

Children are not allowed to wear any make up in school. This includes nail polish, extensions henna and tattoos.



Headscarves

If you choose for your child to wear a headscarf for religious reasons, these should be plain and be either blue or black.
