Visit to the Mayor's Parlour

After the recent visit here our Year 6's were invited to the Town Hall to look around the Mayor's Parlour. What a fantastic experience for them and what an insight in to Bolton's history.

There they stared in awe at the cabinet which houses the collection of the Civic silver and plates, including the Civic Maces. They also saw a portrait of the first Mayor of Bolton Charles James Darbishire who took office in 1838. They learned that the Mayoral chain has the monograms representing each individual Mayor from Charles Darbishire in 1838 right through to Walter Tong in 1940. They also saw many artefacts connected to HMS Dido; this was the warship that the people of Bolton adopted after managing to raise £1.2 million in the 1930's in just one week to aid the War effort.

The children also saw round the Mayor's and Mayoress's Parlours as well as having the privilege of standing on the top of Town Hall steps waving to the people of Bolton.

The Mayor also took part in a q & a with the children and we were so proud of the intelligent questions that they posed to him.

School Uniform

Please can we just remind you of our uniform policy which does state :- black shoes to be worn with uniform, plain black trainers to be worn with active wear, no jewellery apart from plain studs for earrings and a watch - analogue or digital (but no smart watches) - for our older children. Also due to health and safety reasons there can be no earrings for PE - they must be taken out at home before your child comes to school. If they are unable to remove them themselves - we are not able to put plasters on to cover them. Also children's hair should not be dyed or have temporary pieces in; short hair should not be worn shorter than a 'number 2' - patterns and lines are not allowed, hair bobbles and slides should coordinate with school uniform, whilst coloured braids, even though they are gorgeous, are not allowed.

School Dinners

Dinners are £12-75 per week payable on Monday in advance. One month's notice will be required in writing to change to pack lunch.
